## OPTION 2

### STATUTORY DEMAND

If a debt is not disputed, you may issue a creditors' statutory demand for payment.

Service of a statutory demand requires a company to do one of three things within 21 days:

1. Pay the debt;
2. Reach a compromise/settlement; or
3. Apply to court to have the demand set aside.

If one of the three above steps are not taken, the company will be presumed insolvent, and you can file an application to wind up the company and appoint a liquidator.

### APPLICATION FOR WINDING UP ORDER

## OPTION 3

### BANKRUPTCY

Once you have a judgment, the next step is to enforce and recover. With a judgment, you can issue a bankruptcy notice against an individual.

#### Stage 1 – Bankruptcy Notice

Once a bankruptcy notice has been served, the debtor will have to pay the debt, or they will have committed an act of bankruptcy under the Bankruptcy Act 1996 (Cth).

If the debt is not paid, you can file a creditors' petition in the Federal Circuit and Family Court of Australia within 6 months of expiry of the 21-day period to pay.
